Confirmation of record of previous meeting	Mr Taylor on behalf of Mr Hines sought amendments to the draft 9 May 2025 meeting record to clarify items that were raised by Mr Hines and other parties. Proposed amendments were agreed.	Chair
Continuation of discussion about variations to the Award	Discussion of definition of shift work at clause 22(1)(e). Discussion of whether long haul drivers are caught by the definition. Concern that drivers do not meet the definition of shift workers so are not adequately compensated for the features of shift work in their work hours. Discussion of the disability allowance and whether it could be adjusted to ensure adequate compensation. Discussion about the maximum payment of 14 hours and whether it adequately compensates in break downs where drivers are required to stay in close proximity to truck. Discussion about the interaction with the seven-hour rest break. Discussion of provision in Northern Territory and Western Australia for drivers to be paid for a maximum of 17 hours compared to 14 hours elsewhere. Discussion of comparison to inclement weather clauses. Discussion about whether changes to the disability allowance and overtime formula could resolve issue.	VP Asbury and Mr Hines
	Discussion of rostered day off accrual and whether 40-hour divisor is fair. Discussion of relationship between National Employment Standards and awards containing disability allowances.	
	Discussion of the trip matrix. Discussion about schedule of agreed distances. Some parties agreed that schedule of agreed distances is accurate but concern the 75km/hour assumption no longer accurate. Attendees interested in reviewing the history of the 75km/hour assumption to determine if still appropriate.	
	Discussion of potential amendments to clause 16.6 to incorporate loading, unloading and other non-driving work. Proposal of introduction of rule that a driver cannot be worse off because of the method by which they are paid. Discussion about the reconciliation and compliance steps that would be required. Discussion about whether a reconciliation model is compatible with the modern award objectives.	
Next steps	Discussion of research capabilities of the Fair Work Commission (Commission). Proposal that the Commission's research staff begin drafting questions to guide application and further research. Agreement by most attendees that research into the history of the award would be useful, as well as historic analysis of award variation proceedings.	VP Asbury
