# Application for the FWC to deal with a dispute about making a collective agreement

# About disputes about making a collective agreement

The <u>Fair Work Act 2009</u> provides for a collective agreement to be made between a regulated business (a digital labour platform operator or a road transport business) and an organisation that is entitled to represent the industrial interests of regulated workers (the negotiating entities). A collective agreement sets terms and conditions on which the regulated workers covered by the agreement work and how the collective agreement will operate.

If the negotiating entities for a proposed collective agreement are unable to resolve a dispute about making the agreement, either negotiating entity may apply to the Fair Work Commission (Commission) to deal with the dispute.

#### Who can use this form

Use this form if you are a negotiating entity for a proposed collective agreement.

Negotiating entities for an employee-like worker collective agreement will be:

- a digital labour platform operator and
- an organisation that is entitled to represent the industrial interests of one or more employee-like workers.

Negotiating entities for a road transport collective agreement will be:

- a road transport business and
- an organisation that is entitled to represent the industrial interests of one or more regulated road transport contractors.

## Legal or other representation

Representation is where another person (such as a lawyer, paid agent, employee organisation or employer organisation) speaks or acts on a person's behalf, or assists a person in certain other ways in relation to a matter before the Commission. There is no requirement to be represented at the Commission.

There are some restrictions on representation by a lawyer or paid agent.

Generally, a person must give notice to the Commission (by lodging a form F53 – Notice that a person: (a) has a lawyer or paid agent; or (b) will seek permission for a lawyer or paid agent to participate in a conference or hearing) and seek permission from the Commission Member dealing with the matter if they wish to have a lawyer or paid agent represent them by participating in a conference or a hearing.

Apart from participating in a conference or hearing, a person's lawyer or paid agent can represent them without permission, unless the Commission decides otherwise. For example, the lawyer or paid agent can prepare and lodge written applications, responses and submissions with the Form F100 – Application for the FWC to deal with a dispute about making a collective agreement

Commission, and communicate in writing with the Commission and other parties to the matter on the person's behalf.

The requirement to give notice and seek permission for a lawyer or paid agent to participate in a conference or hearing, does not apply if the lawyer or paid agent is:

- an employee or officer of the person
- a bargaining representative that is representing the person, or
- an employee or officer of an employee or employer organisation that is representing the person.

Rule 13(2) of the <u>Fair Work Commission Rules 2024</u> sets out further exceptions to the requirement to give notice and seek permission.
