4 yearly review of modern awards – $\underline{AM2014/223}$ – Dredging Industry Award 2010 $\underline{[MA000085]}$

Higher duties provision (item 13 of the <u>further revised summary of submissions</u>)

- [1] Pre-reform awards' higher duties provisions (extracted below) consistently refer to 'An employee directed by the employer to carry out **any** duties'
- [2] AWU in its submission of 18 April 2016 at paragraph 21 submitted:
 - 'This clause entitles an employee to be paid at the higher rate where they "perform the duties of a position at a higher classification level". The current award has similar wording. We submit the alternative wording of "work" rather than "duties", to reflect that not *all* duties must be performed, but rather the work of that higher position, on that occasion. This is consistent with the wording in the three pre-reform awards mentioned above which entitled the higher rate when "any duties carrying a higher rate" were performed. The same amendment was made to the *Asphalt Industry Award* 2010 during the review of group 1A and 1B awards.'
- [3] AWU's concern may be resolved by inserted of the word 'any' in place of the word 'the' in clause 10.4 as follows:
 - 'An employee engaged to perform the <u>any</u> duties of a position at a higher classification level for more than two hours during any one day will be paid the rate applicable to that higher level for all work done on that day.'
- [4] At paragraph [120] of Statement [2009] AIRCFB 450 the Full Bench indicated which awards the *Dredging Industry Award 2010* proposed to replace:
 - 'The draft Dredging Industry Award 2010 reflects some consent between interested parties comprising various unions (the MUA, AIMPE, AMOU and the AWU) and the Dredging Industry Industrial Secretariat (DIIS). The exposure draft proposes to replace three existing awards: the *Maritime Industry Dredging Award 1998*, the *Dredging Industry (AWU) Award 1998* and the *Marine Engineers (Non Propelled) Dredge Award 1998*.'
- [5] Relevant extracts of the higher duties provision are set out in the table below.
