Re: [2018] FWCFB 4175 - AM2014/250 and others

BACKGROUND

- The Full Bench of the Fair Work Commission ('FWC') published the 4 yearly review of modern awards – Award stage – Group 4 awards (AM2014/250 and others) Decision¹ ('Decision') on 7 August 2018.
- 2. The Full Bench has invited parties to file submissions on a number of outstanding matters and provisional views.
- 3. Of the Awards to which this feedback has been invited, the Australian Workers' Union ('AWU') is an interested party in the following:
 - 3.1. Cemetery Industry Award 2010;
 - 3.2. Food, Beverage and Tobacco Manufacturing Award 2010;
 - 3.3. Funeral Industry Award 2010; and
 - 3.4. Pest Control Industry Award 2010.
- 4. The submissions of the AWU are below.

Cemetery Industry Award 2010 (& Others)

United Voice Proposal re: Casual Loading

- 5. The AWU supports the submissions of United Voice addressed in paragraphs [158] to [161] of the Decision.
- 6. The AWU notes that the amendment proposed by United Voice is required as a result of a drafting issue and should not be controversial.

- 7. If, however, a party takes exception to the amendment as proposed, we make the following brief submission.
- 8. The casual loading is payable for all hours worked by a casual employee. It has consistently been held that the casual loading is payable to compensate casual employees for entitlements under the award and the NES that casual employees are excluded from, such as paid leave². As the exclusion from such entitlements is not restricted to ordinary hours, neither is the compensation payable.
- 9. Additionally, the current award provision³ does not restrict the payment of the casual loading to ordinary hours.

- 12. In relation to the proposed table at Schedule A.1.1, the AWU proposes that, for the purposes of clarity, the column titled *Day shift* should instead be titled *Minimum hourly rate*.
