

Submission to the Fair Work Commission: Review of the Supported Employment Services Award 2010 - AM2014/286 – Support of draft consent determinations

NDS welcomes the opportunity to provide this submission to the Fair Work Commission (FWC) in respect of the Review of the Supported Employment Services (SES) Award 2010 through matter <u>AM2014/286</u>.

NDS supports the proposed consent determination lodged by the Health Services Union on 31 July 2017. The consent determination relates to the modifications to the Supported Wage System (SWS) developed through the conciliation process conducted by DP Booth in the matter AM2013/30.

NDS agrees to the adoption of the modifications to the SWS for inclusion in *Schedule D – Supported Wage System* in the SES Award.

NDS notes that the modifications to the SWS do not take the form of a new wage assessment tool, but are adaptations for the purposes of conducting productivity based wage assessments in supported employment settings.

NDS remains of the view that wage assessment tools that only measure an employee with disability's relative production output do not take into account the complexities of supported employment settings. Nor do they take into account the commercial and economic considerations associated with running a Disability Enterprise.

Consequently, NDS supports the inclusion of the modifications to the SWS on the basis that the SWS is not the sole mandated wage assessment tool in the SES Award.
