Dear Justice Hatcher,

MS2024/1, MS2024/2, MS2024/3 – Applications for Minimum Standards Orders – Extension Request

We refer to the above applications and the Statement issued by Your Honour on 6 September 2024 (**Statement**).¹ In particular, we refer to [24] of the Statement which invites interested parties to make submissions regarding the provisional views expressed in the Statement by 12:00 pm on Friday, 20 September 2024. The Australian Industry Group (**Ai Group**) will file submissions in response to the Statement.

A significant number of Ai Group's members will be impacted in different ways by the applications. Our membership includes major platforms as well as road transport businesses and affiliated associations with a relevant interest in applications and other supply chain participants that may be affected by the applications. These entities have a diverse array of interests which need to be worked through carefully in recognition of the fact that these applications are the first test of the new and novel legislative regime regarding minimum standards orders.

We respectfully request that all parties be granted an extension of one week (until **Friday**, **27 September 2024**) to file any submissions. This short extension would allow Ai Group to more fulsomely consult with industry in relation to the applications and Statement. This request is also advanced at the urging of Ai Group members who will be impacted by the proposed orders and are contemplating advancing separate submissions.

This request is also made in light Ai Group's involvement in various other Fair Work Commission (**Commission**) matters, several of which have been commenced by the Commission and are being dealt with in accordance with tight timeframes. These include the following:

 Preparing submissions and attending various consultation conferences in relation to the Gender Undervaluation proceedings regarding a number of modern awards;

- (b) Appearing in proceedings before the Commission and preparing material in relation to various other matters, including, among others:
 - (i) AM2024/41, an application concerning the *General Retail Industry Award* 2020;
 - (ii) AM2024/34, new proceedings concerning working from home in the *Clerks Private Sector Award 2020*; and
 - (iii) AM2024/35, an application to vary the *Road Transport (Long Distance Operations) Award 2020*; and
- (c) Preparing reply submissions and evidence in AM2023/28, AM2024/16 and AM2024/30 concerning the *Social, Community Home Care and Disability Services Industry Award 2010.*

We are also actively engaged in various other urgent consultation processes with government.

Given the short extension sought, and the proposal for it to be granted to all parties, we do not envisage that the interests of any other party would be unduly prejudiced. We also contend that it is appropriate that the Commission take an approach to consultation with industry over these matters that maximises the level of engagement of affected parties.

We thank the Commission for its consideration of our request.
